Memorial Trail Ride

Last year money was used for a clinic in which ten 4-H kids brought their own horse and the instructor taught them to become better in horsemanship. I heard it was an excellent clinic. The money we donated helped with the cost, so it was cheaper for them to attend. The money was used for a game night in which prizes were awarded for the kids and their horse. Doing this is helping more children at a time.

Thursday's Child Vice President Susan Hefty and Treasurer Steve Maerz make sure that every child referred to them by social workers and doctors receive gift cards. For years now Sue and Steve--with the cooperation of their loved ones--have quietly gone about the business of helping Santa. Sue's own children, now adults, have grown up watching their mom tackle the annual Christmas project!

Whatever the wish, we want to make



them come true. The generous support we have received not only this past year, but also for the previous 30 years allows us to continue to be able to meet all of the requests that come our way.

Hot Meals Provide Food for Comfort



Thursday's Child funds six evening meals per year for parents of seriously ill children who are patients at American Family Children's Hospital in Madison. Often the parent does not want to leave the child's bedside, the child does not want the parents to leave, and for some families who spend much time in the hospital, the cost of their food becomes a significant budget concern.

This is the 12th year that Thursday's Child has been able to continue this worthwhile service.

Each evening meal serves 50-60 people. Thursday's Child donates \$3,000 per year to provide six meals.

The hospital, through money donated by NFL Alumni, funds one meal per week. Other meals come from organizations like ours.

Any sick child's wish is to have Mom or Dad close by. Providing family members with a hot meal at the end of a stressful day is very much appreciated.

Unexpected donation will help more families

Thursday's Child received an unexpected and generous gift from the estate of Nancy Van Dyke, Madison, who died on April 5, 2014 at the age of 94. Born in Stevens Point, she married her college sweetheart, Lt. Col. L.N. Van Dyke after he returned from military service in Germany during WW II. They moved to Madison to work on advanced degrees at the University. Lt. Col. Van Dyke was an assistant football coach at the University of Wisconsin and later became Director of Grant-in-Aid for the U.W. Athletic Department. Nancy was a librarian at Maple Bluff Elementary, Shorewood Hills Elementary and Phillip Falk Elementary. Mrs. Falk, who had no children of her own, bequeathed \$70,000 to Thursday's Child. At the time this newsletter was printed, Thursday's Child had received a check for \$43,500 from Mrs. Van Dyke's estate with an additional amount to be received at a later time.

Turnquist Fundraiser held by family

The Morgan Turnquist Memorial Fundraiser was held on May 17 at the Brat and Brau, Madison. A car show, silent and live auction, and \$5.00 lunch on a beautiful spring day raised \$15,000 for Thursday's Child. We thank Morgan's parents, Ted and Tammy, for organizing this benefit in their daughter's memory. Their kindness and generosity will touch the lives of many children and their grateful parents.

From Morgan's obituary: "All Morgan ever wanted was to be ordinary. This was not to be, she was extraordinary. She touched so many lives in her short time on this earth. While cancer was all she knew, she refused to let it define her."

She died on July 7, 2013, at the age of 17. Thursday's Child is honored to be a beneficiary of Morgan's legacy.

Many contributors to the Morgan Turnquist Fundraiser included heartfelt notes about their memories of Morgan. We share this special one:

"Morgan Turnquist was truly the personification of God's grace, an embodiment of courage, determination and faith - a really remarkable young woman. I have a vivid memory of Morgan after church in the Fireside Room fiercely encouraging one of her peers. I couldn't hear her words, but I did see their effect - and I was in awe of her courage."
